<b>Need</b> Need for the program with evidence to support the stated need.	<p>Prior to the deactivation of WCC's previous Elementary Education (AAELEM) program, we had over 150 students enrolled in this program. The need for elementary teachers is high. According the BLM's Occupational Outlook Handbook, Kindergarten and Elementary Teachers job outlook is 4% (as fast as average) for 2021-2031, while the Michigan O*Net identifies Elementary Teachers as a having a "Bright Outlook" and is "projected to grow faster than average (employment increase of 8% or more) over the period 2021-2031 for the US nationwide."</p>
