Students will review and expand the lexicon and grammatical structures learned in the prerequisite courses. Students will learn how to grasp the main ideas of both formal and informal short speeches in academic settings. The goal of the course is to

improve students' levels of communicative competence in listening, speaking, reading and writing in modern Chinese, with an emphasis on the traditional, non-simplified, character writing system.
