Rationale: We currently offer first and second semester basic and intermediate skill Acting courses. These courses, focusing on monologue and short scene work are successful and generate interest in ensemble acting. This new course is a natural progression from the basic skill courses to the application of skills in a group project consisting of several scenes or full one-act staging/performance.

Proposed Start Semester: Winter 2014

Course Description: This is an advanced performance-oriented course with an emphasis on ensemble acting skills and techniques. These skills apply to stage and film acting. There is an emphasis on more advanced voice projection, staging, physicality, character development and emotional expression. This course will focus on advanced ensemble projects involving script adaptation, script interpretation and group performance skills necessary for performing in an ensemble theatre setting that may include performances for the community or campus. The lessons, focusing on dramaturgic and acting skills, vary depending on the literature selections, which change each semester.
