- 4. Identify and perform the six essential movable chord voicing.
- 5. Perform advanced level songs utilizing the six essential movable chords.
- 6. Perform a traditional 12 bar blues chord progression.
- 7. Demonstrate how to improvise a blues solo.
- 8. Play a major scale.
- 9. Play a pentatonic scale.
- 10. Play a blues scale.
- 11. Play a major 7th chord with the root on the fifth and sixth strings.
- 12. Play a minor 7th chord with the root on the fifth and sixth strings.
- 13. Play a dominant 7th chord with the root on the fifth and sixth strings.
