- 4. Provide physical therapy services to a variety of patients appropriate to entry level performance by the end of the second clinical rotation.
- 5. Prepare and deliver a Physical Therapy related in-service at each healthcare facility, or substitute one inservice for the completion of the APTA clinical site information form (CSIF).
- 6. Document all aspects of patient care, including patient history, data collection, interventions performed, patient response, establishing and assessing short term goals, patient progression, and patient/family needs.
- 7. Participate in physical therapy department activities including in-services, interdisciplinary meetings, staff meetings, family meetings and education, billing, requirements and quality assurance activities.
- 8. Manage a patient's progress in an established plan of care and communicate with the Physical Therapist regarding the patient's status or modifications made in the patient's interventions.
- 9. Demonstrate the ability to complete an effective self assessment of technical and professional skills.

The Clinical Performance Instrument, from the APTA, is to be completed by the student's Clinical Instructor midterm and at the end of the clinical education experience. The CPI has 20 performance categories using a visual analog scale to determine the student's level of performance.

The students will complete the Physical Therapist Assistant Student Evaluation: Clinical Experience and Clinical Instruction form, from the APTA, at the midterm and at the end of each clinical rotation.

2. Indicate the standard of success to be used for this assessment.

The student must be within the 90th percentile in a minimum of 15 out of 20 performance standards on the CPI for the first rotation. (Scored by the Clinical Instructor).

The student must be within the 90th percentile in 17 our of 20 performance standards on the CPI for the final clinical rotation. (Scored by the Clinical Instructor). There must not be any "red flag" items in each of the clinical rotations.

75% of the students, each year, will be within the 90th percentile on the CPI (Clinical Performance Instrument) as scored by the Clinical Instructor.

3. Indicate who will score and analyze the data.

Full-time faculty will blind score.

4. Explain the process for using assessment data to improve the course.

The Clinical Performance Instrument for PTA 250 will allow the ACCE to determine areas of strengths and weakness in clinical education preparedness and in other areas of the curriculum.

The feedback received from all Clinical Instructors will be used to implement changes as appropriate in the curriculum. In addition, feedback received from the Physical Therapist Assistant Student Evaluation: Clinical Experience and Clinical Instruction will be utilized for clinical site and instructor development.
