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## **Course Objectives**

- 1. Define the terms, identify the importance, and discuss the attribute aspects of: organizational culture, safety culture and Safety Conscious Work Environment (SCWE).
- 2. Evaluate the benefits of implementing a SCWE.
- 3. Identify the roles and responsibilities for front line leaders in establishing and maintaining a safety culture according to International Safety Management(ISM).
- 4. Identify how the behaviors of front line leaders influence safety culture.
- 5. Compare and contrast how behaviors, personal bias, personality types, interpersonal interactions, communications, and trust affect safety culture and organizational culture.
- 6. Identify potential indicators and/or warning signs of a breakdown in the SCWE.
- 7. Identify behaviors that foster trust, a questioning attitude, and a receptiveness to raising issues.
- 8. Compare and contrast safety culture case studies by utilizing/applying tools, concepts, and resources.
- 9. Review resources available to the front line leader to assist in problem solving.
